Art, activism and citizenship

This fall's main exhibition at Kunsthal Charlottenborg presents five international artists as part of the IMAGES 16 project *An Age of Our Own Making*.

Through sculptures, performance, installations, films, and collages the artists Ibrahim Mahama (Ghana), Kamal Aljafari (Palestine), Moshekwa Langa (South Africa), and Tita Salina & Irwan Ahmett (Indonesia), focus on the opportunities for creating, claiming or using public spaces as part of their practice as artists and citizens in a society.

The exhibition pursues artistic examinations of the policy of public spaces and explores the importance of us taking part in society and helping create the values that society consists of and is characterized by. By suggesting more holistic world views, the exhibition and the works inspire to new ways of being co-creators and citizens of the world.

Immersion and takeover of public spaces

The exhibition not only takes places within Kunsthal Charlottenborg's exhibition walls, but also spills out into the urban space with Ibrahim Mahama's spectacular collage of African jute sacks on the entire facade of Kunsthal Charlottenborg facing Nyhavn and Tita Salina & Irwan Ahmett's sailing island of trash. Furthermore, Lorenzo Sandoval creates an editor's room, where one can immerse oneself in the thoughts behind *An Age of Our Making*.

An Age of Our Making is a tripartite exhibition project developing from May 2016 until January 2017 in Holbæk, Roskilde and Copenhagen. The exhibition row is curated by Solvej Helweg Ovesen and Bonaventure Soh Bejeng Ndikung and realised by Holbæk Kommune.
